#### 15.2 INFORMATION CONCERNING CANTABRIA

#### Plane:

The airport, located 5 kilometres to the east of the city centre, has flights connecting Santander with Barcelona, Madrid, Gran Canaria, Seville, Valencia, Málaga, Alicante, Palma de Mallorca, London (Standsted) Rome (Ciampino), Frankfurt (Hahn) and Liverpool. There is a permanent bus service which connects Santander airport with the city centre bus station every 30 minutes. The bus ticket costs approximately  $\in$  1.5.

Additionally, Bilbao Airport, situated about 120 kms from Santander, operates international flights to and from the main European capitals. There are buses and trains to and from Bilbao Airport to the city centre, where there is a coach service to Santander.

#### **Train**

Santander has two railway stations that correspond to two different railway companies (RENFE and FEVE) and they are situated at opposite ends of the same building.

RENFE connects Santander with Madrid and other places in Spain. This railway company has a radial track network, the centre of which is the capital of Spain.

Those who prefer to drive here can cross the border at Irún-Hendaya, taking the National Road 634, or the toll motorwayA-8 to Bilbao, and then following directions for Santander. Once here, the visitor will realise that the city's lay-out is along three main roads: Avenida de Los Castros (with the University campus in its northern part), Paseo de General Dávila, and the road which joins Cuatro Caminos with the city-centre and Sardinero (see Santander street on the appendix of this Guide).
