Upon individual arrangement – German language skills not required, proficiency in English is sufficient.



#### Admission to Master Level Courses:

Students should have completed *either*

- a formal bachelor degree *or*
- three years of study *or*
- an equivalent of 180 ECTS

in that subject area.

#### Language Requirements:

Students should have a least level B1 in the language of instruction. No formal test required from ERASMUS students - confirmation by home institution is sufficient.

#### Welcoming Service:

The International Office offers Welcoming Service to exchange students (pick-up from train station, assistance with administrative procedures, city and university tours etc) supported by S.T.E.P.S: Student Tutors for Exchange Program Students.



#### Orientation Program:

The International Office organizes a month-long orientation program, including an intensive German language course prior to the beginning of each semester in September/October and in March/April:

#### Intensive German Language Course during Orientation (3 ECTS)

Students can take this course only once: before the start of their studies or in between two semesters (not at the end of their stay). Usually, 3 levels are offered (Beginners, Elementary, Intermediate). Advanced German can only be offered if there are enough participants. Students can earn 1 ECTS extra by signing up for additional culture modules offered as part of the orientation program.
