Application Procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners must nominate students on the nomination form sent by email - Required Documents for Application (below) must be sent by post or email in one PDF file to sanaa.lefdou@escdijon.eu - From mid November students will then be contacted by email with their login and passwords so that they can then apply on line and upload an ID photo (.jpg) - From mid-November students will receive an email with the link to online course registration. Students must have the required prerequisites and the Home University must approve the choice of courses and number of credits <p>Admission documents needed for the visa registration will be sent to the Home University on time.</p>

Official transcript in English from the Home University (courses attended + grades) - 3. Copy of European Health Insurance Card (European students) or copy of certificate in English or in French from your insurance company stating that you are personally insured abroad (non European students staying one semester only) - 4. Curriculum vitae / résumé in French or English - 5. Copy of birth certificate (only for non European students staying for the full academic year) - 6. A certified copy of your degree translated into French or English (only for students who have obtained a degree)

Induction week	<p>A COMPULSORY induction week is organised before the beginning of classes in order to help students to settle into Dijon: administrative workshops and help concerning visa, health insurance, accommodation matters and opening a bank account.</p> <p>Entertainment activities will be organised by the association for international students, "Melting Potes"</p>
Pick-up Service	<p>All students must fill in their arrival information on our website at the following link: www.bsbu.eu/international/practical-informations/pick-up-service-and-induction-week/</p> <p>The form is available from June for the Autumn and from December for the Spring</p> <p>A free pick-up service from Dijon train station will be provided on specific dates.</p>
Accommodation	<p>BSB does not have its own residence. However, the International Office can help you to find the best option either in residencies or homestays. Applications received after the deadline will still be processed but we cannot guarantee that housing will be found.</p>
Accommodation Expenses	Generally from € 360 to € 550 per month
Insurance Policy	<p>It is compulsory for all students living in France to subscribe to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Personal liability insurance "<i>responsabilité civile</i>" - Insurance policy for your accommodation covering at least water damage and fire. <p>You can take out insurance cover (which usually includes both liability insurance and insurance policy) with the company of your choice or a French bank when opening a bank account.</p>
Housing Benefit	<p>Exchange students can apply for housing benefit from the French government (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales, CAF) under certain conditions (to be confirmed during the induction week as they are subject to change).</p> <p>For more information : www.caf.fr</p>

Health Insurance

All students are required to have health insurance from their home country covering medical repatriation for the full semester or the full year.

European students (under 28 years old): will have to bring their European Health Insurance card and will be then exempted from registering for French social security.

Non European students (under 28 years old) staying 1 semester only: will be exempted from registering for French health insurance provided that they show an International Health insurance certificate from their home country

Non European students (under 28 years old) staying for the full year: Even if they have private health insurance, they will be required to register for French health insurance (207 Euros for the 2012/2013 academic year). The application form will be provided upon arrival by the International office.

European and non European students over 28 years old: Are not entitled to French student insurance and will have to be covered by an international health insurance or private insurance.

Additional costs

- **Visa (compulsory for all Non European students)**: Once in Dijon, a fee of **58 €** (2012-2013 amount) will be required for the validation of your long-term student visa.
- **Health insurance**: Non European Economic Area citizens under 28 years of age by October 1st, 2012 and staying for the full academic year will have to pay the annual fee of approximately **€ 207** for the French Social Security (compulsory health insurance).
- **Student union Fee (for all students, European & Non European)**: Payment during the induction week :

Degree seeking students for 2 years	€ 170
Exchange students / double degree : for 1 year	€ 90
Exchange students for 1 semester	€ 45
