2.3 Costs

2.5 Pre-semester programme

We offer a pre-semester programme including Intensive German Language Course, Cultural Sensitivity Training, Campus tour etc. in order to provide the students with all necessary information and assist them with the required procedures. Additionally students may make use of the pick-up service.

2.6 Mentors

International students will be assigned an Austrian student from the JKU to mentor and assist them upon arrival and during their stay including picking them up from the airport or train station, assisting with university enrollment procedures as well as introducing international students to activities in Linz and Austrian student life.

2.7 Students with disabilities

The <u>Institute for Integrated Studies</u> at JKU supports students with disabilities (blind and partially sighted people, deaf people and those with limited hearing, people with limited mobility) through assistive technologies as well as advisory and support services.

2.8 Visa

EEA Citizens:

For students from the European Economic Area (EU and EFTA countries) and Switzerland there are no specific requirements to enter Austria. A valid passport is sufficient to enter Austria.

Other Nationals:

For students from non-European Union or European Free Trade Association countries, an entry or residence permit for entry into and residence in Austria is required. 2.9 Health insurance

EU students only need their European Health Insurance Card.

Some countries have a national insurance agreement with Austria – students should enquire about the regulations and procedures.

For students from countries that have no national health insurance agreement with Austria, we strongly recommend purchasing health insurance from the Upper Austrian Health Insurance Company (\underline{OOGKK}) for a fee of about \in 50 per month.

3 Requirements

3.1 Language requirements

JKU requires proof of language proficiency in German and/or English (level B2 or higher of the <u>Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)</u>*).

EXCEPTION: For the Master's programmes General Management and Applied Economics a minimum English level of C1 is required.

We accept the following certification:

- All internationally recognized language certificates such as TOEFL, Goethe etc.
- English or German courses at the required level (B2) as noted in your Transcript of Records
- Confirmation issued by your university in regards to your language skills (German OR English) at the required level (B2).

The recommended language level for teaching staff is C2.

3.2 Additional requirements

Exchange students are expected to take a minimum workload of 20 ECTS credits per semester.
