Effective April 30, 2012, students who are eligible for Canadian study permits (students studying in Canada for over 6 months) will be eligible for health insurance coverage through the Manitoba Health card. Students who are not eligible for a Canadian study permit must obtain international health and dental coverage from their home country or through a private insurance company upon their arrival.

Course choices:	Exchange students can select any course that is offered during their exchange semester as long as the student meets prerequisite requirements and there is space available in the course. Some courses may require professor approval for enrolment.	
Examinations	Format of exams vary. Final exams are written in the last 2 weeks of the school. Students are responsible to stay in MB until they complete all exam requirements. Requests of early leave of exams are usually not considered.
