Additional Information	Exchange students are entitled to one Polish language course, one other foreign language course (BA level) and one sports course per semester free of charge in addition to the courses offered by their receiving unit.
Accommodation	There is a limited number of places in the University of Warsaw dormitories. The majority of places are in double rooms with a shared bathroom and kitchen.  Students apply for accommodation in the on-line application form at <a href="https://www.mobility.uw.edu.pl">www.mobility.uw.edu.pl</a> . The places are assigned on a "first come first served" basis therefore it is important to apply as early as possible. Students who do not receive a place in a dormitory are offered assistance in finding a room or apartment to rent.
Mentor Program	Every Exchange Student is encouraged to apply for a Mentor (a local student who can help with finding accommodation, opening a bank account and other practical matters). The Mentor program is organized and coordinated by the Erasmus Student Network UW <a href="www.uw.esn.pl">www.uw.esn.pl</a> Once the student is accepted he/she will be provided with the information about the Mentor program.
